

Community Frame for Plant Variety Protection – the historical background in the early 90's

- -common activities to create and set up the European Single Market,
- -the existing possibility for european-wide marketing of seed of varieties listed in only one Member State,
- -10 individual national PBR systems.

Community Frame for Plant Variety Protection – the legal background


- based on the 1991 UPOV Convention
- laid down in Council Regulation (EC)
 No. 2100/94
- administered by the Community Plant Variety Office (CPVO)




Important elements of Council Regulation (EC) 2100/94 of 27 July 1994 on Community Plant variety rights


- -Co-existence and correspondence of systems on national and Community level,
- -independent and self-financed Community
 Agency supervised by an Administrative
 Council,
- -full integration of Member States and their Examination Offices.






National PBRs and applications for PBR

- less PBR applications and granted rights,
- compensation by DUS tests for the CPVO,
- constantly growing cooperation within Europe.




Impacts and benefits for the breeders

- -one title for the whole of Europe,
- -lower financial and administrative burden,
- -higher incentives and capacities for breeding activities.

Conclusions and Outlook

The expectations of the CPVR System for breeders, users and the national economies have been fulfilled.

The successful implementation of the system has been realised by the close cooperation between the CPVO and national partners and (for agricultural and vegetable species) based on the Seed Directives.

New challenges and developments can only be tackled in mutual action bilaterally and multilaterally between EU bodies, Member States and third parties.
